PREFACE

This Standard was prepared by the Standards Australia Committee BD-044, Fixing of Ceramic, Natural and Reconstituted Stone tiles to supersede AS 4992.2(Int)—2004, Ceramic tiles: Products for installation, Part 2: Adhesive: Test methods.

The objective of this Standard is to provide methods for testing the compliance of ceramic tile adhesives.

This Standard is an adoption with national modifications and has been reproduced from ISO 13007-2:2005, Ceramic tiles—Grouts and adhesives, Part 2: Test methods for adhesives, and has been varied as indicated to take account of Australian conditions.

Variations to ISO 13007-2:2005 are given in Appendix ZA.

As this Standard is reproduced from an International Standard, the following applies:

- (a) Its number does not appear on each page of text and its identity is shown only on the cover and title page.
- (b) A full point should be substituted for a comma when referring to a decimal marker.
- (c) Any French text on figures should be ignored.
- (d) In the source text 'this part of ISO 13007-1' should read 'this part of AS 4992.1 and ISO 13007-2 should read AS 4992.2'.
